<u>Prayer:</u> 1) Court to grant the Plea to the Jurisdiction and dismiss Cockrell's administrative appeals; 2) order that Cockrell take nothing by this lawsuit and that the District recover its costs and attorneys' fees if it prevails in accordance with Texas Water Code § 36.066(g) and (h), including an opportunity for the District to submit a fee application, affidavit, and evidence of its Section 36.066(g) and (h) costs and fees; and 3) order such other relief to which it may be entitled at equity or law.

Mike Gershon, MPGCD attorney, reported that Cockrell Investment Partners LP has indicated that they do not intend to proceed with the lawsuit if talks that are ongoing with Fort Stockton Holdings LP resolve their issues.

Sam Cruse, attorney for Cockrell Investment Partners LP, reported that Cockrell and Fort Stockton Holdings, LP met about 3 weeks ago and discussed the proposed MPGCD rules and are working on a compromise. Talks are still in progress. Eddie McCarthy III, attorney representing Fort Stockton Holdings, LP, agreed with the statement(s) made by Sam Cruse.

- XII Progress Reports: Well Registrations, Production Permits, Drilling Permits, Data Loggers, Drought Monitor Map and ongoing Water Quality Analysis.
 - Well Registrations: Several registrations have been received from Parsley Energy.
 - Drought Monitor Map: The current drought monitor map presented. It has not been updated since we received 4" of snow on Wednesday.
 - Production Permits: We will have 3 next month.
 - Drilling Permits: Parsley has requested to drill 8 wells for Oil and Gas Use.
 - Data Loggers: Two data loggers will be installed on the Springs.
 - Water Analysis: The Winter Water quality analysis is beginning.
 - We have requested that Prisoners be used to clean up under the bridges at the Pecos River in Pecos County. We will pay for the meals for about 6 prisoners for 2 days.

XIII Consider and/or act upon General Manager's Correspondence.

- October 2017 Texas House of Representatives, 85th Legislature, Interim Committee Charges were presented to the Board.
- 2017 Interim Legislative Charges for the Senate were presented to the Board.
- Regarding a Capitan Well that blew out: E-mail updates on the progress for the groundwater monitoring well were presented to the Board for their review of the progress on the drilling activities performed by Pearl Resources and PDS Drilling and updates from Mark Moore with Approach Environmental, LLC.
- General Manager Ty Edwards reported that Devon Energy is plugging several of the flowing San Andres wells. 2 to 4 of the wells have been plugged currently. H₂S gas is flowing at 200 ppm in some of the water.
- Boehmer Lake needs to be plugged. It may take around \$5 million dollars for plugging. Mr. Edwards will get with Representative Nevárez to see if funding is available for the plugging(s). The Railroad Commission is aware of the situation.
- Belding Pecan Farm will pull 3 wells and camera them, and may want to fix or replace them. 2 wells are in the Rustler Aquifer, and 1 well in the Capitan Reef Aquifer.
- Texas Mesonet Program: The Texas Water Development Board is partnering with other entities to develop a statewide earth observation data collection network called TexMesonet. The data collected can be viewed at www.texmesonet.org/viewer. Information collected will include temperature, precipitation, wind speed, relative humidity, barometric pressure, solar radiation, soil moisture, soil temperature, and evapotranspiration. 5 sites are slated for Pecos County so far and include 2/La Escalera Ranch, 1/Ty Edwards, 1/John Dorris, 1/Pecos County and Reeves County line. Contact Ty Edwards if interested in participating in the program.
